

### **From Our Pastor ...**

You may have noticed that Communion Sundays have been ending a little differently than other Sundays. At the end of worship on these Sundays, I invite the children forward and we divvy up the remaining bread and juice. The benediction is given with a mass of children around me and then together we process down the aisle and outside. Some of you have joined us to see what happens next. If you've missed it, let me tell you about it:

Once outside, a beautiful thing happens. The oldest children help the youngest, each keeping an eye on the other. Some kids take oversized fistfuls of bread, soak it in the juice and let it dribble down their chin as they take giant bites. Others immediately begin to tear off the bread and toss it to the birds. The leftover juice is poured on the ground and it isn't long before a game to see who can throw the bread the farthest begins. There is always enough. It doesn't take asking twice for the kids to share their bread.

I love this time with the children! More than that, I love this witness! For here is one place where I see the Body of Christ come together in how the kids rally around each other. Here is where I see the joy of faith, as they laugh and leap with grape juice stained smiles. Here, in their game of who can throw the bread the farthest is the enthusiasm to share the Good News with the world! Those big, messy bites showing the unreserved, insatiable longing we all have to receive more of the Bread of Life.

This past Sunday, on World Communion Sunday, this ritual had an even deeper meaning to me than usual. You see, I started this tradition with my church in Ohio two years ago. The idea came out of an Adult Bible study. The group learned that once the bread and juice for Communion are blessed, the 'leftovers' are to be eaten entirely, or go back to the earth—as a sign of God's grace for all creation. The group wondered how our church could be attentive to caring for the 'leftovers' and suggested having the children spread the bread and juice in our prayer garden. Thus this ritual was born and quickly became a favorite tradition.

What a wonderful delight for me on World Communion Sunday, to be able share this ritual with a new group of children who I am coming to know and love; while realizing that another group of beloved children is sharing the same joyful tradition! Truly, this is the joy of life together as Christ's church and I invite you to experience it for yourself and join us next Communion Sunday!
