#### From Our Pastor...

Last week, I gathered with 18 other young clergy as part of a three-part continuing education series. We met in Kansas City to focus on our first theme of "Leadership & Vision." While there, we toured different churches and had a chance to meet with their pastors. Rev. Adam Hamilton spoke about strategic planning and having an MVP: Mission, Vision, Plan. In his 26 years at Church of the Resurrection, he could recount in detail every step of their development; each connected clearly to their vision. As we toured the active construction site of their new sanctuary, he talked not about the next decade, but about the next century and the plan for the space for the generations yet to come.

Meanwhile, Pastor Tim Keel drew a picture of a tree that sparked new imagination within me. It's such a simple and common image: a tree, ripe for the harvest, its roots sprawling deep underground. But this is the vision of his ministry, he calls it "abiding." He says that instead of focusing on creating ministries, he seeks to find the places where God is already at work, and then live (or 'abide') in those places. He referred to it as "chasing life." The nourishment of life with God, like deep roots that can't help but bear fruit. He structures his personal life and the communal life of the church around living in the places where God's movement is already felt in their community.

Two different ways of visioning and making meaning; both equally creative and far more complementary to each other than they first appear. As our own Vision Team gets set to begin meeting at the end of the month, I begin to wonder: What is our MVP? Where are the places for us to abide in our community? How do we chase life? I invite you to pray every-day over these questions. Share with me what reflections God reveals for our vision and our next faithful, life-chasing step together.
