## From the Pastor—

At this time last year, we celebrated Epiphany Sunday in worship with the introduction of "Star Words." Words written on Blue or Yellow star-shaped post-it notes. We were to put our stars somewhere we would see them. From there, we would reflect and pray on that word throughout the year. I affixed my star words: Comfort and Change (I'm not sure how I ended up with two) on the inside of my phone case. I saw them A LOT over the past year. And I even reflected on them periodically, too.

It is only now with another Epiphany upon us that I realize how comfort and change played out in my faith this year. You know it was a hard year for me. For much of it, comfort seemed to taunt me. At best it was fleeting, always leaving before I was ready for it to go. In my darkest midnights, it was empty and so far from reach I could no longer imagine it at all.

Change, on the other hand, sought me out. Again and again. In the unexpected ways that change always comes to us. I can think of half a dozen moments when I tried to force change out of desperation. To control it. But it was the surprising changes this year that most shaped my life and my healing. These changes were always beyond me--surfacing at moments when I let myself be human and let God be God. When I let others love me and care for me even when I felt like I had nothing to give in return.

The holy mystery is that now, as I reflect fully on this past year and its changes, the words of this familiar Advent Scripture are echoing in my heart: "Comfort, o comfort, my people says God. Speak tenderly...she has served her term, her penalty is up" (Isaiah 40:1-2). To be sure: this is an everlasting comfort, long in coming, but graciously given. And for that, I am beyond grateful! Though that's not to say that I wouldn't mind having something like "stability" or "consistency" as my Star Word this year after last one!

Dear ones, I pray that your Star Word revealed God to you in a new way this year and that it might again this Epiphany!

It has three keyboards that are immediately visible; and those pedals at the base? Well that is entirely another keyboard. In addition, there are lots of buttons that need to be pushed at the right time that do magical things to all or some of the keyboards.

Yvonne explained to me that it took her YEARS to learn to play this instrument, and yet we take her expertise for granted without much thought to the complexity of it all. ## **A Caroling Thank You!**

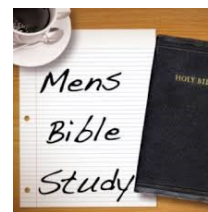
