To align with our MLK Service Day on January 14 (see page 3), our January Melodies supports North Helpline.

The organization opened in 1989 with Emergency Services in response to the overwhelming amount of people in need that local churches regularly saw at their pantries. These churches were among North Helpline's first supporters, referring clients and helping the organization get off the ground financially. The Emergency Services group at that time was able to provide financial assistance with utility shut off and eviction prevention.

The Food Bank was added in 2001. In 2010, they moved locations to a brand new facility in Lake City. Amongst Seattle's many social services, North Helpline is distinguished by this uncommon trait: the convergence of distinct resources under one roof. From Our Pastor...

On Sunday in worship we celebrated Epiphany--God revealed to all people. This is the story of the star and the wise men's journey to see the Christ child. I shared how when I think of this story, my mind immediately goes to the three gifts given to the child: gold, frankincense and myrrh. What I have often overlooked is the gifts that the wise men first received. Like the gift of good news to declare the message of Jesus' birth. The gift of courage to set out on their way. Or the gift of the star to guide them on their journey. The gift of sight to see the newborn child. The gift of joy that overwhelmed them when they arrived at Jesus' side. The gift of God born in the flesh, revealed to creation in the birth of a child.

All of these are the gifts first offered to the magi. In their wisdom, they received these gifts from God. I believe that they ultimately fell to their knees and opened their treasure chests *only* in response to God's gifts to them. They gave out of the abundance of having been filled by God's good gifts in their own lives. In celebration of this, we each received our own 'star gift': a word written on a star-shaped post-it to guide us to God revealed in our lives. This is a chance to be filled with God's abundance.

We were invited to ponder this word in our hearts in the same way that Mary pondered all that she heard in her heart. I invited everyone to put their star somewhere where they will see it everyday so they can reflect on how God is revealed through this star gift. We will come back to this and share our stories throughout the year. So consider this your reminder: how is it going with your star gift in this first week? How have you started to reflect upon the meaning of this gift in your life? Where have you seen it played out? Where are you still looking for it arrive? How is it leading you?

I pray that we have the wisdom of the magi to open ourselves to the journey as we follow the star!


